

Anti-Trafficking Commitment Art

Art can be used to communicate a powerful message to survivors, letting them know that the community refuses to turn away from their pain. Consider using art to raise awareness of the crime and to act in solidarity with those human trafficking victims.

Here are examples of art projects for your parish, church, or youth group:

Purchase a white canvas and draw a picture in the center symbolizing the fight against human trafficking. Bring the canvas to your antitrafficking presentations and workshops. Invite participants to sign their names on the canvas as a public promise not to turn away from victims.

contests or paint fests where participants create posters, pictures, or murals that call for the community to come together to combat human trafficking. Create a "mobile" art gallery to display at church, school, and/or community events.

- Design posters, flyers, or business cards with the national human trafficking hotline number.
 Hang or leave in public places so others know where to seek help.
- Participate in the <u>Red Sand Project</u>, a great opportunity to work in groups to raise awareness in the fight against human trafficking.
- Share pictures of your murals/posters/canvases on social media; congratulate those involved!
