# **Fundraisers**

Support the work of a local organization that provides comprehensive care to trafficking victims.

#### Host a 5K walk, run, or bike ride

- Sell race entries and t-shirts
- Rent out booths to local social service providers, anti-trafficking coalitions, and/or advocacy groups at the start and finish lines of the race
- Reach out to local media to cover the event and raise awareness of human trafficking prevention in your community

#### Host a benefit luncheon or bake sale

- Seek donations for ingredients or catering
- Enlist volunteers to serve and prepare the food
- For luncheon, sell tickets for the meal

#### Hold a raffle or silent auction

Use ethically sourced items and services

#### Have a charity day at a local business

- Ask a local business to donate a portion of the day's proceeds to a local anti-trafficking organization
- Spread the word and invite your community to come out and support the cause and business



# Service Activities

Serve vulnerable populations in your community and organizations that support survivors.

#### Workers' rights workshop

- Hold a workshop for immigrants in your community about their civil and labor rights
- Consider offering it in the migrants' native language

#### Service project

 Organize a service day for a local organization that aids survivors of trafficking

#### S.O.A.P.

 Help label soap bars with the National Human Trafficking Hotline number

#### Traffick Cam

 Use your cell phone to help combat trafficking in hotel rooms – Download the <u>Traffick Cam</u> app



# Shop Fair Trade

Support businesses that are certified Fair Trade or are making efforts to ensure their supply chains are free of forced labor.

#### <u>Learn about the impact of your purchases</u>

- Take the <u>Slavery Footprint Survey</u>
- Download <u>Sweat and Toil</u> to learn about goods produced with child & forced labor
- Review Verité's <u>Commodity Atlas</u> to better understand the link between certain products and forced labor
- Check out <u>Know the Chain</u> to see how companies can address forced labor risks

#### Ethically traded coffee

 Use/sell fair trade coffee at home, work, and church

#### Make a fair-trade Easter basket

 See this <u>Pinterest</u> board to build your own fair-trade Easter basket

#### Use your purchasing power

- Encourage your family and work place to purchase ethically sourced goods
- Become familiar with slave-free products U.S. Catholic Sisters against Human Trafficking
- Order ethically produced products from organizations such as SERRV

#### Host an ethical foods potluck

- Look for items that were grown, produced, harvested, and distributed without the use of labor exploitation or human trafficking
- Consider using ingredients purchased from local farms or grown in your garden



# **Donation Drives**

Connect with local service providers to learn about current needs and to deliver items for distribution.

#### Food/clothing/blanket/linens drive

Collect basic need items for local survivors

#### Hygiene Kits

Put together Kits with toiletries for trafficking victims who have been identified in a raid

## Learn & Advocate

#### Learn about local organizations

 Find local service agencies and coalitions and learn how your group can become involved

#### Invite guest speakers to share with your group

- Invite speakers to discuss their encounters with human trafficking survivors in their profession (i.e. law enforcement, health providers, teachers)
- Invite organizations serving victims (Catholic Charities, Bethany Christian Services, etc.) to share

#### Host a book club or documentary screening

- Read books on anti-trafficking and prepare discussion questions
- Host a movie night with the <u>Price of Free</u>, a documentary on child labor and child trafficking

#### Hold a workshop on responsible consumerism

 Highlight companies that are working to eradicate slavery from their direct supply chains

#### Host a letter-writing party

- Review USCCB's anti-trafficking toolkit for examples of letters to the editor to raise awareness and affirm proper coverage of HT
- Write local leaders and organizations to support anti-trafficking initiatives and raise awareness
- Write your favorite company, encouraging them to clean up their supply chains

#### **Choose Responsible Travel Companies**

 Ask if the hotel where you plan to stay has signed The Code



# Faith-Based Activities

#### Pray for victims of human trafficking

- Pray the <u>Stations of the Cross</u>
- Host a candlelight vigil
- Include a prayer for victims in worship aids
- Include intentions for victims and survivors in the Prayers of the Faithful during Mass

#### Hold a fellowship hour

- Use fair trade coffee and donuts
- Explain to parishioners how you are supporting labor rights and human dignity

### **Bulletin announcements**

- Advertise parish anti-trafficking events
- Include National Human Trafficking Hotline #
- Highlight practical steps everyone can take to combat trafficking and support local victims

#### Host an ecumenical event

 Invite interfaith community members and leaders to discuss how your community can help prevent human trafficking together

#### Observe awareness days

- January: National Slavery and Human Trafficking Awareness Month
- January 11: Human Trafficking Awareness Day (Participate in <u>#WearBlueDay!</u>)
- February 8: Feast Day of St. Bakhita and Day of Prayer for Victims of Human Trafficking
- July 30: World Day against Trafficking in Persons



# Youth Activities

Engage youth in your community activities and encourage their involvement.

#### Hold a poster contest

- Create posters about the signs of human trafficking and what to do if someone is trafficked
- Display posters in the parish hall

#### Hold an education workshop

- Host a "Become a SHEPHERD" session for youth
- Encourage students to discuss how they can combat human trafficking

#### Teach youth to be safe online

#### Make use of social media

- Share articles about prevention and advocacy
- Start a social media campaign using hashtags and event photos to raise awareness

#### Ice cream party

 Hold an ice cream party using fair trade ice cream (Ben &Jerry's, 365 Fair Trade Certified Chocolate)

#### Movie night

- Hold a movie night and host a discussion
- Find a documentary from USCCB's list

#### Make and sell "Stop Trafficking" bracelets

- Purchase letter beads, string them together to spell "SHEPHERD" or anti-trafficking slogans
- Make friendship bracelets with blue heart pattern.
  The blue heart represents the UN's anti-trafficking campaign.
