



Stewardship Strategies

There are many ways to raise money for your efforts to fight human trafficking and educate others about it! These are just a few ideas to help you get started.

Bracelets

Sell anti-trafficking bracelets! You can purchase materials at local craft stores (JOANN Fabrics, Michaels) There is much room for creativity. Here are ideas of what your bracelets could look like:

- ❖ Blue to represent the fight against trafficking ([DHS Blue Campaign](#))
- ❖ A message that says “Stop Human Trafficking” or “End Exploitation”

Bake Sale

This is a simple and popular activity that anyone can participate in, either by helping during the sale or providing baked goods prior to the event’s kick off. Take the opportunity to educate your customers about your anti-trafficking ministry and how their money will be used!



Raffle/Silent Auction

Ask people to donate items or volunteer a service for a raffle or silent auction and sell tickets. This is a great opportunity to showcase and educate others on the importance of fair-trade items.

Ethical-Trade Night

Hosting a fair-trade night also can help raise awareness about the significance of buying ethically-made products where workers rights are protected, and wages are just. Check out [Serrv sales!](#)
