

FAMILY REUNIFICATION

For family members of Afghan Nationals residing in the United States

I-730 Refugee/Asylee Relative "Follow to Join" Petition

Petitioner: Refugees, Asylees, and Lawful Permanent Residents who were refugees or asylees (Only the Principal Applicant can petition)

Beneficiary: Spouse and unmarried children under 21*

SIV "Follow to Join"

Petitioner: Special Immigrant granted Lawful Permanent Resident status (I-485 approved)

Beneficiary: Spouse and unmarried children under 21**

P-3 Affidavit of Relationship (AOR) Family Reunification

Petitioner: Refugees and asylees, Lawful Permanent Residents who were formerly refugees or asylees, Lawful Permanent Residents through the SIV process

Beneficiary: Spouse, unmarried children under 21, and parents; special circumstance add-ons

I-130 Petition for Alien Relative

Petitioner: Lawful Permanent Resident (Green Card Holder) Beneficiary: Spouse and unmarried children under 21

Petitioner: U.S. Citizen

Beneficiary: Spouse, married and unmarried children, parents, and

siblings

Filing time limit: 2 years of admission (refugee) or grant of asylum status (asylee). Can be extended on humanitarian grounds at USCIS' discretion

Beneficiaries must be able to access a country with U.S. consular processing to complete any interviews and other requirements

*If children are close to turning 21 when parents apply (or they go over 21 during the pendency of the application, there may be age-out protections under the Child Status Protection Act

No Fee

**Can only access follow-tojoin process if family relationship existed when the principal adjusted status

Beneficiaries must be able to access a country with U.S. consular processing to complete any interviews and other requirements

Special immigrants granted LPR status should contact the NVC at NVCSIV@state.gov to request consular processing for the spouse and/or children as derivative beneficiaries

No Fee

Filing time limit: 5 years of admission (refugee) or grant of asylum status (asylee)

Beneficiaries must generally reside outside of their country of origin and go through refugee processing Beneficiaries must be present in a country with U.S. Embassy or Consulate for application processing

Fee: \$535 plus additional fees to the Department of State for immigrant visa processing
